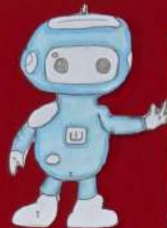

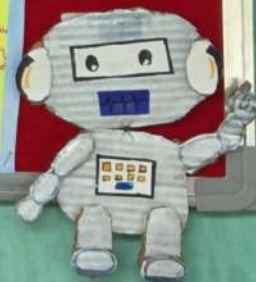

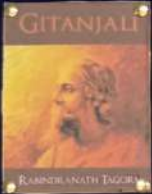

He began writing early and in 1901 he published his first book 'Gitanjali'. It was a collection of poems in Bengali. It was translated into English by the poet W. G. Sebald.

He is known for his poems, novels, and short stories. He was awarded the Nobel Prize in Literature in 1913 for his collection of poems 'Gitanjali'.

The Four Noble Truths

These are the foundation of Buddha's philosophy of life (offering life meaning, offering liberation from all causes of suffering, offering a cause of suffering, offering liberation from suffering) by following an 8-fold path.

- These eightfold path
- 1) Right Understanding (seeing reality clearly)
- 2) Right Aspiration (Determination to stand up against evil - Transcendence)
- 3) Right Speech (Truthful and non-compassionate)
- 4) Right Action (ethical conduct)
- 5) Right Livelihood (earning a living without harm)
- 6) Right Effort (cultivating positive states of mind)
- 7) Right mindfulness (awareness of body, feelings, etc. things)
- 8) Right Concentration (deep meditation)



Buddha's Parinirvana

Buddha Parinirvana is one of the most sacred festival of the Buddhist. It is celebrated on the full moon in May (Vaisakha) and it is a day of "Vaisakha Sankranti" day marking the birth, enlightenment and renunciation of Siddhartha Gautama, the Buddha. The entry to the Buddhist land is called an Ashoka, representing his peaceful, wisdom and enlightenment. He said like a tree give a shade, and liberal people representing "I'll never forgetful" that he left his feet and white meditating under the tree. The people remember the Buddha's teaching and make themselves to practice. The festival is a sign of peace and liberation of wide generation. On the eve of Buddha Parinirvana, people usually create water and milk to the Buddha's feet. The people use it to give of love. Buddha's enlightenment. Buddha is celebrated throughout Indian like people wear white clothes and on this occasion and go to the Buddha temple, parks, houses and streets are opened to Buddha's feet, after placed in water.
